The ideal candidate will bring strong instructional skills, a commitment to inclusive practice, and an appreciation for First Nations ways of knowing and learning.

- Ontario College of Teachers (OCT) certification in good standing
- **Primary and/or Junior Division Qualifications** (P/J preferred)
- Strong classroom management and differentiated instruction skills
- Experience teaching in multi-grade or small-school environments (or willingness to learn)

- Knowledge of or willingness to learn **Ojibwe (Anishinaabemowin)**
- Experience working in First Nations school settings or with Indigenous learners
- Training in trauma-informed practice, restorative approaches, or land-based learning
- Ability to integrate Indigenous perspectives across the curriculum

- Teach all core subjects for Grades 3–5 in a combined classroom setting
- Implement engaging, culturally responsive, and differentiated instruction
- Incorporate Anishinaabe culture, values, and community resources into daily learning

- Provide supervision of students during non-teaching times such as recess, lunch and before and after school
